Phi Beta Psi Sorority is a national organization which was founded in Columbus, OH, in 1904. It is not affiliated in any way with a college or university, but is a civic organization.

The purpose of Phi Beta Psi is to participate in charitable work, to promote fraternal relationship among its members and to establish and assist other chapters of Phi Beta Psi.

National Project 2015-2016 Research Grants

At the 2015 National Convention held in Tampa, FL, the membership voted to give \$315,600.00 total in research grants. The six (6) doctors listed below each received \$52,600.00 for the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

Each request for funding is reviewed and evaluated by a volunteer Medical Advisory Board, consisting of five (5) leading researchers at major research institutions across the country. After their rating of each proposal, the Phi Beta Psi Board of Directors makes the final decision of which grants will be presented to the membership for approval.

All researchers who are approved for funding must submit a progress report at the end of the fiscal year. They must explain how and where the money was spent, and the results that occurred. Their grants will be extended for a second year if the Medical Advisory Board feels that progress is being made. Since 1973, over \$8,634,157.00 has been given to doctors for cancer research.
